



Sustainability requirements - European championships, EurILCA Europa Cups and EurILCA Masters:

Why having sustainability requirements?

From 2022 onwards sustainability is a mandatory requirement for all EurILCA events. Our goal is to make all EurILCA events plastic free and more sustainable to be aligned with our values and raise awareness among the sailing community. These requirements are to help and guide you to achieve this goal.

Our requirements

<u>1. Register your event in the Clean Regattas program</u> by Sailors of the Sea/Oceana https://www.sailorsforthesea.org/programs/clean-regattas</u>

Select best practices (minimum best practices to select are shown below)
You are encouraged to download the toolkit during the registration of your event to Clean Regatta to help achieving each action. For questions regarding the details in the toolkit you can contact Clean Regattas and for all additional questions, clarifications or help, contact EurILCA Sustainability (sustainability@eurilca.org)

6 months prior to the event:

Send your sustainability plan to sustainability@eurilca.org (a form will be up on the website for you to fill in) explaining which best actions you chose and what is your implementation plans like:

- The organizations you are involving
- The time and place of the cleanup
- Your single-use plastics elimination strategy
- The types of food you are planning to serve and how (details on the cutlery needs and vegetarian alternatives)

Within a month following the event:

Send a report to <u>sustainability@eurilca.org</u> within a month after the event explaining (a form will be up on the website for you to fill in):

- Which planned actions were implemented? Were there some best practices that couldn't be achieved?
- What worked and what didn't
- How it can be improved
- Feedback from participants (if available)






You will receive a certificate from Clean Regattas if the actions are completed successfully.

EurILCA Europa Cups and EurILCA Masters that have less than 150 participants are required to select **at least** these best practices shown above resulting in a participant certification.





2. Mast sleeves' management:



- Sailors that already own mast sleeves should bring and use them in the event
- Sailors who do not have the sleeves with them will have to purchase them from the race office
- At the registration, sailors must show their mast sleeves
- They will be used only to distinct sailors' fleet colors
- The numbers <u>do not matter</u> so sailors can flip their socks inside out if they do not display a number and re-use them in future events
- Sailors are responsible for their sleeves, it is a part of their equipment. They should keep them at the end of the event and bring them for the next one or will have to purchase new ones
- Host clubs should <u>not collect</u> the sleeves or give away free ones in the registration

3. If you are hosting an event in 2022

If you are hosting an event in 2022, the timeline will be more flexible for your event and you must contact sustainability@eurilca.org as soon as possible to start the planning.
