Why Implement Sustainability Requirements?

Starting in 2022, sustainability has become a mandatory requirement for all events managed by EurILCA.

Our goal is to make all EurILCA events plastic-free and more sustainable, aligning with our values while raising awareness within the sailing community.

These sustainability requirements are designed to guide and support you in achieving this goal.

01 Register your event with the Clean Regattas Program by Sailors for the Sea / Oceana

- Select the best practices for your event.
- We encourage you to download the toolkit provided during registration to help you implement the actions.

02 Three months before the event

Submit your sustainability plan to sustainability@eurilca.org – Include details on:

- Organizations you're collaborating with
- The timing and location of any cleanup efforts
- Your strategy to eliminate single-use plastics
- Food offerings and their details (including cutlery needs and vegetarian options)

03 One month after the event

Submit a report to sustainability@eurilca.org within one month of the event, including the following:

- What actions were successfully implemented? Were any best practices not achieved?
- What worked well, and what didn't?
- Suggestions for improvements
- Feedback from participants (if available)

If the actions are completed successfully, you will receive a certificate from Clean Regattas.

Note: Taking photos of sustainability practices is crucial for both the report and the visibility of the program. We will help promote these efforts on our social media platforms.
